# Culver City Residents Age 60+ CULVER CITY SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAM

This program currently is providing frozen, nutritionally balanced lunches for Monday through Friday to eligible participants. New eligible clients are defined as those who are Culver City residents age 60 years old and over, their spouse of any age & their disabled children that live with them. Per the directive of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, seniors may receive meals in one of the following ways:

- Family member, friend, neighbor, volunteer or caregiver age 59 or younger can
  pick-up the meals for registered Culver City Senior Nutrition Program patrons over
  the age of 60 at our drive-up service. Drive-up service is located in the Senior
  Center parking lot Mondays and Wednesdays between 10:30 am and 12:30 pm.
- For registered nutrition patrons ages 60+ who do not have anyone to pick up their meals, the City will deliver frozen meals on Mondays and Wednesdays between 11 am and 2 pm.

All meals provided are frozen, with two meals provided on Mondays and three meals provided on Wednesdays. The Culver City Senior Nutrition Program can be contacted at 310-253-6712 or via email at daniella.gutierrez@culvercity.org.

### Culver City/Palms & Mar Vista Residents Age 60+ CULVER/PALMS MEALS ON WHEELS

Currently it takes 2-3 days to enroll a new Meals on Wheels client. In order to enroll, you must have a home address. Culver-Palms Meals on Wheels is *temporarily* not charging standard fee; the fee is negotiated with client. They are currently serving hot meals to their registered clients Monday-Friday. For clients who need meals on the weekends, they deliver two meals on Thursday and three on Friday. Culver-Palms Meals on Wheels can be reached at 310-599-0666. They are typically on-site until 1 pm so it is best to call weekday mornings.
