COVID-19 Ongoing Requirements for Employers

PREVENT COVID-19 TRANSMISSION AND PROTECT WORKERS AND THE COMMUNITY

Employers must be vigilant and continue to protect their workforce and the community by following infection control measures and reporting COVID-19 cases to Public Health.

As of February 3, 2023, the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards have been discontinued. The Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Non-Emergency Regulations are now in effect until February 3, 2025. Please note that the <u>County Health Officer Order</u> continues to require employers to report any cluster of suspected or confirmed worksite COVID-19 cases to the County Department of Public Health.
