



## 2022 Grants for Enhanced Community Integration for Children and Adolescents

In Fall of 2022 DDS authorized the Social Recreational Grant project to improve accessibility of integrated social and recreational programs for children and adolescents with I/DD, to utilize and leverage existing community resources to enhance and develop integrated and inclusive social recreation programming, and to increase the number of providers who offer integrated and inclusive social rec services.

On March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 DDS identified the grant recipients for all 21 Regional Centers. Westside Regional Center had six applicants receive funding for their projects.

## 2022-23 Grants for Enhanced Community Integration for Children and Adolescents

## Background

 The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) provided DDS \$12.5 million for Social Rec Grants

 Targeted for families, children, and adolescents with I/DD to fund projects that enhance and develop integrated and inclusive social and recreational programs

All 21 Regional Centers were approved for grant participation

## Awarded Projects 1 of 6

#### **ACEing Autism**

- Adaptive tennis programming service provided in Inglewood, Los Angeles (90049), Pacific Palisades
- Funds to support increased capacity, additional locations, and advertisement/outreach/community engagement activities
- Proposals approved with 5 regional centers

## Awarded Projects 2 of 6

## **America Youth Soccer Organization Region 1031**

- VIP program to improve quality of soccer experience for regional center eligible youth
- Services provided in Culver City, Inglewood, Ladera Heights, and others
- Funds to support use of behavior and adaptive physical education consultation to improve support capacity and for advertising & outreach for the program

## Awarded Projects 3 of 6

#### Free 2 Be Me Dance

- Dance program
- Service based out of Marina Del Rey, with community-based functions throughout Los Angeles
- Funds to support increased capacity and advertisement/outreach/community engagement activities

## Awarded Projects 4 of 6

### Friendship Circle of Los Angeles

- School based mentoring program
- Service provided throughout Westside catchment area
- Funds to support increased capacity and advertisement/outreach/community engagement activities

## Awarded Projects 5 of 6

#### Jump for Joi

- Fashion and Arts & Crafts based programming
- Services provided in Inglewood
- Funds to support increased capacity and advertising & community outreach

## Awarded Projects 6 of 6

#### **Cayton Children's Museum**

- Sensory sensitive events at the museum
- Service provided in Santa Monica
- Funds to support use of occupational therapy and other consultation resources to improve support capacity and adolescent weight wall changing tables

## Term of Grant

- Grant period extends from 4/1/23 through 12/1/23
- All projects required to submit progress reports to WRC in July, October, and December.
- Programs were not required to be vendored as a pre-requisite or requirement for application. Projects may pursue vendorization at a future point
